Consideration of authorizing Mayor's Signature on a Professional Services Agreement (PDA) 7.1 with the Region IV Economic Development Association (RIVDA) for development of a business strategy (including an introduction, organization structure, functional structure, staffing plan, financial projections, articles of incorporation and bylaws, marketing strategy, and a U.S. Economic Development Administration (EDA) Economic Development District (EDD) application template) for establishing an EDD for Idaho Region III [ACTION ITEM] (Clerk's Note: The Western Alliance for Economic Development (WAED) is a non-profit, membership based collaborative effort between the Idaho Dept. of Commerce (IDOC), local governments, and businesses which fund an Economic Development Professional (ED Pro) to assist with new business start-ups, business retention and expansion, and business relocation in and into rural Canyon and Gem Counties. The City of Greenleaf serves as the fiscal agent for the WAED, as required by the IDOC Rural ED Pro Grant Program which helps fund the WAED ED Pro position. The WAED is pursuing re-establishment of an EDD for Idaho Region III, which would be funded in part by an EDA grant and expected to make EDA grant funding, revolving business loans, and both community development and economic development services – likely including grant writing and administration – available to Idaho Region III. The RIVDA business strategy will provide a template for standing up an Idaho Region III EDA EDD agency. The expense of the RIVDA PDA will be covered by IDOC and USDA-RD grants, already awarded. As fiscal agent for the WAED, the RIVDA PDA is with the City, as are IDOC and USDA-RD grants and grant administration requirements. The WAED Board of Directors reviewed the RIVDA PDA at their 28 Feb 2023 meeting and recommend approval to the Greenleaf City Council.)
